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# CyberSecurity Malaysia slams unethical footage

**IPOH** — CyberSecurity Malaysia slammed the act of placing live surveillance footage on *Insecam.com*, calling it unethical and an invasion of privacy.

Its chief executive officer Dr Amiruddin Abdul Wahab said: "For *Insecam.com* to broadcast live feeds is clearly unethical. That is why we have various methods to safeguard users."

Amiruddin said there were laws, including the Computer Crime Act 1997, Communications and Multimedia Act 1998 and the Personal Data Protection Act 2010, to protect consumers but he was quick to point out

the laws were only applicable if the offence was committed in the country.

He said cyber users should take the initiative to safeguard their own security by changing their passwords often.

"I understand that solution providers inform their customers to change their passwords, but many tend to take it for granted," he said.

"Changing your default password with an alphanumeric password is sufficient, while adding a symbol makes it more difficult. Changing your password every three months is the best."
