CYBERJAYA, 6 November 2023 - CyberSecurity Malaysia Digital Forensics team led by Sarah Khadijah Taylor has been acknowledged by INTERPOL for being the main key contributor to the development of the INTERPOL Guidelines for Seizing Virtual Assets. The document was launched during the 2nd INTERPOL New Technologies Forum Law Enforcement Conference, officiated by the Bavarian State Minister of Justice, on 12th October 2023 in Nuremberg, Germany.

INTERPOL Guidelines for Seizing Virtual Assets provides, to its 194 member countries, a comprehensive reference in the field of virtual assets investigation. Its scope encompasses the entire process of seizing virtual assets, covering pre-process, during and post seizure process of the virtual assets. As a result of the increase of reported offenses involving virtual assets, this document highlighted for the prosecutors, judges, and law enforcement the procedure for managing virtual assets evidence.
