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## CYBERSECURITY MALAYSIA SIGNED AGREEMENT UNDER THE MALAYSIAN COMMON CRITERIA EVALUATION AND CERTIFICATION SCHEME WITH STRATSEC AUSTRALIA The Honourable Minister of MOSTI will witness the signing

Canberra, Australia (August 5, 2010) - CyberSecurity Malaysia, an agency under the Ministry of Science, Technology, and Innovation (MOSTI), has signed a formal agreement with stratsec Australia, one of the leading providers of independent information security consulting and testing services in Australia and South East Asia.

With the agreement, this will be the first time an Australian company or a commercially based security evaluation facility will set up operations under the Malaysian Common Criteria Evaluation and Certification Scheme (MyCC Scheme).

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The MyCC Scheme, operated by CyberSecurity Malaysia - <u>www.cybersecurity.my/mycc</u> is a systematic process of evaluating and certifying the security functionality of ICT products. It aims at increasing Malaysia's competitiveness in quality assurance of information security based on the Common Criteria (CC) standard or ISO/IEC 15408, and to build consumer's confidence towards Malaysian information security products.

Datuk Seri Dr Maximus added that the MyCC Scheme set up by the Government is an effort to enhance the national cyber security industry. "There are too many breaches of ICT security and by raising the quality standard based on the international benchmarks, it would increase trust and confidence in the Malaysian ICT products and hence, stimulate the growth of the industry," he said.

According to Lt. Col. Husin Jazri, CEO of CyberSecurity Malaysia, the agreement will help grow a world class IT security evaluation facility in Malaysia and provide increased opportunities for Malaysian ICT product developers."The collaboration with stratsec for our MyCC scheme will help to position Malaysia for the future -- by providing a strong branding for 'Made in Malaysia' ICT products -- due to compliance with well-known and recognized international standards ISO/IEC 15408. As a result of a strong MALAYSIA BRAND, consumer confidence and market demand for Malaysian-made ICT products will be greatly increased", Husin added.

Meanwhile Peter Lilley, CEO of stratsec said "The Malaysian Government, through their economic stimulus package, has shown great understanding of the importance of IT security as a driver of the overall IT industry".
