Let's celebrate Safer Internet Day 2010

Kuala Lumpur, 01 February 2010 – Cyber Security Awareness For Everyone (CyberSAFE <u>www.cybersafe.my</u>), the outreach arm of CyberSecurity Malaysia is leading the celebration of **Safer Internet Day 2010**, in Malaysia.

Safer Internet Day is part of a global drive to promote a safer Internet for all users, especially young people. This event, organized by INSAFE - a network of national nodes that coordinate internet safety awareness in Europe - and supported by the European Union through the Safer Internet Programme, has been celebrated since 2004 in a growing number of countries.

The 7th edition of Safer Internet Day (SID2010) will be celebrated in Europe, as well as in more than 30 countries around the world, on 9th February 2010. Since this is the first time SID is observed in Malaysia, a list of activities have been lined up from the **8**th **to 11**th **February** to cater for all walks of life – students, working adults, those in the private sector, as well as the public sector, InfoSecurity Professionals, and the Critical National Information Infrastructure (CNII) sector (see the list below).

There is also a CyberSAFE Digital Video & Poster Competition from 1-28 February 2010 - calling all budding movie directors and creative designers to submit a short digital video or a digital poster on Internet Safety to win prizes like Netbooks, iPods (Touch & Nano), Digital cameras, HD Video Camera, etc.

Lt. Col. Husin Jazri (Retired), CEO of CyberSecurity Malaysia said, "The main **theme** of SID2010 is **Personal Image Management Online**, with the slogan **"Think before you post!".** This theme is closely linked to online safety issues, such as privacy and protection of personal data, cyber bullying, and grooming. The theme is aimed at raising awareness among young people regarding the fact that photos, once online, remain online and therefore, they should think carefully about the potential consequences of their actions before posting their own photos or those of their friends"

(1) <u>8th February: InfoSecurity Professionals Networking</u>

Time	:	1500-1800
Venue	:	PWTC, Kuala Lumpur
Theme	:	"Shifting Cyber Landscape; Gearing Towards Innovation"

The objective of this networking is to provide Information Security Practitioners an avenue to collaborate and share knowledge, thus enabling them to keep abreast with the latest industry trends and development. The networking will become a platform for strengthening the ability to protect information assets from ever-changing cyber threat vectors.
